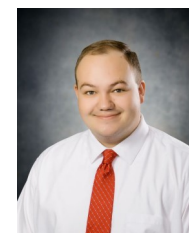

7. The final decision on all costumes will be made by the administration.

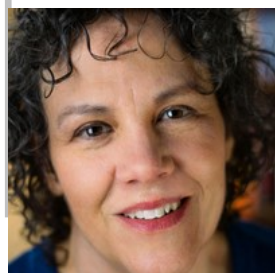
Author Visit!!

An Important Message from the Jackson Junior High School Counselors:

Per Missouri state statute, every school district must provide trauma-informed, developmentally appropriate sexual abuse training to students in all grades not lower than sixth grade.

School districts must include the following components in their training:

- * Instruction providing students with the knowledge and tools to recognize sexual abuse
- * Instruction providing students with the knowledge and tools to report an incident of sexual abuse
- * Actions that a student who is a victim of sexual abuse could take to obtain assistance and intervention
- * Available resources for students affected by sexual abuse

This year we are partnering with The Green Bear Program who have been traveling throughout South-east Missouri since 2001 educating children on body safety and abuse prevention. In 2019, they created S.A.F.E. Guides for 6th-8th grade students.

Please e-mail your student's counselor if you have any questions or would prefer they do not participate. This information will be presented to 8th grade students in November and 7th grade students in March.

Also, as part of this same statute, our JJHS student support specialist, resource officer, and counselors will be presenting information on Suicide Awareness & Prevention. Please review [this link](#) for more details. These presentations will take place for both 7th & 8th graders throughout the month of October.
